WE GATHER AS A COMMUNITY OF GOD'S PEOPLE

As we gather for worship today we acknowledge that the land on which we gather is Treaty 6 Territory. We honour the Cree and Métis people for whom this place has been a homeland for thousands of years. We respect the sacredness of our home and the ground on which we walk and we are grateful to gather here in peace and hope.

Processional:

Good morning, everyone. Welcome to our Palm/Passion Sunday celebration. With our Sunday school children and Choir leading us, we will enter the Sanctuary singing, "This is the day that God has made" (MV #122). As our Christian tradition and calendar goes, today we celebrate the anniversary of that time long ago when Jesus triumphantly entered the city of Jerusalem for his last time. As he rode into that city on a donkey, a big crowd of people gathered along the streets to welcome him as a hero, as their liberator, as their king. So, we are told, friends and enemies sang their hosannas, they laid down their garments or cloaks, and palm branches for him to pass on, and that way they paid him their homage. May this time of worship today be a way to welcome Jesus into the city of our lives with all the love and peace he brings.

CALL TO WORSHIP:

Gather with the crowds to await the coming of Jesus.

We have taken his words to heart; we are moved by his compassion.

Rejoice with the disciples, that God's Anointed One has courageously chosen to enter the city.

Cheer with the crowd, "Blessed is he who comes in God's name."

We rejoice that God's just and compassionate way has been recognized, but we wonder, will the love of God triumph in the coming crisis? Amen.

PRAYER FOR GUIDANCE: (in unison)

God, we are approaching the end of our journey, and difficult days lie ahead for us. Just now we hear the cries of the crowd, as they welcome Jesus into the city. Their cries call us to join in their celebration, yet we are uneasy. Before us lie the shadows of the cross.

God, we pray that you walk with us as we journey through the events of the Holy Week: the anger of Jesus when he confronts those who turned your house into a den for thieves. The last meal that Jesus will share with his friends where one will betray him.

The struggle in Gethsemane as Jesus faces what he knows must happen, but is deeply grieved. His arrest when his friends will abandon him and one will deny him. His death on the cross.

God, walk with us through these days, so when we stand at the foot of the cross, we will see past it to the wonder of the empty tomb that renews our faith in your love revealed to us, through the witness of Christ Jesus, who shares with us your reign to come. *Amen.*
